

My sister Shamim Naeem Toor was a very lively person, who touched hundreds of hearts in her short life. She was a very hardworking and dedicated government officer, who served for many years with integrity, honesty and fairness.

She attended Lahore College for women for her undergraduate degree. Throughout her stay at the college her performance was exemplary and she earned the reputation as the best debater. Along with her older sister Tasneem, she was part of the 'Musahib Sisters Team'. The amazing team won many trophies for their college and individual awards for themselves. After four years of college, she joined Punjab University to pursue higher education in Psychology.

At the University she maintained her excellence and was very well respected by her fellow students and teachers.

After earning her Master's in Psychology, she decided to continue her family's tradition of teaching and joined the teaching staff of Government College Mandi Bhauddin as a lecturer in 1976. Given her extraordinary administrative skills and admirable interpersonal skills, she was asked to accept the position of Principal at the Government College for Women,

District Phalia in 1983. She served this position for several years and earned a name for herself as an honest and fair Administrator.
